1936

Konrad Zuse began work on the first electromechanical computer.

It read instructions from 35mm film.




Alan Turing began to develop the Turing machine, which was the foundation for ideas about computing.




1943

Tommy Flowers demonstrated the first electric programmable computer, the Colossus, which could read encrypted German messages.



The EDSAC performed its first calculation. This computer ran the first graphical computer game.

1950


The Univac 1101 was the first computer that could store and run a program from its memory.

1975


The first portable computer was sold. The IBM 5100 had a five inch screen and weighed 55 pounds.


The Apple Computer company sold their first computer, the Apple I.

Youtube was launched, allowing users to upload, share and view videos online.




2007
